


BISON Exhibit

Floorplan/Themes/Display Modules

Shipping crates that double as display modules reconfigure to create an interactive environment that combines history, artifacts and hands-on activities to bring to life the story of this great North American mammal. Completely self-contained, flexible and designed to travel, the exhibit can easily be installed in a variety of spaces as small as 1200 sq ft.




Exhibit Elements

Unit Modules - 17

Bench Crates - 4

Large Fabric Banners/Bison Hides

Hung on connectors between multiple crates and poles branching off single crates, these elements provide a contextual backdrop for the exhibit and highlight important works.

Native American/Bison Central Element

Arranged in a rough circle in the center of the exhibit, a grouping of Native American and bison modules forms the core of the thematic connections

Industrialization Mini-Context

Factory setting, using a line shaft, pulleys and bison hide belts, powered by a user-operated crank

Timeline/Infographic

Showing number of bison over time, important dates in bison history and related themes (Native American, Industrialization, Conservation, etc.)

Artifact Cases

Sprinkled throughout the exhibit, artifact sized-vitrines highlight pieces important to the story.

Interactives

Built as integral parts of the exhibit structure. Audio, video, flippers, story cards, hands-on activities, scrapbooks, scale-model of tipi, and a hand cranked line shaft.
